

Freddie gets FAW accolade

Former Aberystwyth Town defender Aneurin Thomas was recognised by the Football Association of Wales at the FAW football awards dinner at the National Museum of Wales on Monday, as he claimed the Welsh Premier League Clubman of the Year Award.

Affectionately known as 'Freddie' within Welsh Premier League circles, the stalwart called time on his Aberystwyth Town career at the end of last season in an emotional final game against Newtown at Park Avenue.

Thomas played in every single season since the league's formation back in 1992 having started out in the League of Wales with Llanidloes Town, before switching to Aber, where he spent three seasons between 1993 and 1995. A move to Llansanffraid then materialized, before a spell of just over a year with Newtown was followed by another couple of seasons with the Seaside.

Thomas returned to the Robins in 2001/02, before a brief sojourn with Carmarthen Town, until he returned to Park Avenue in 2003 where he remained until May.

The centre-back played 399 games for the Black and Greens, after making a total of 366 (+33) appearances, with a total of 447 league starts plus substitute appearances. He is sixth on the all time Welsh Premier League list. The inaugural award was won by Gary Lloyd of Llanelli last season.

Aize pulls no punches

Carmarthen Town manager, Mark Aizlewood, has expressed deep disappointment following his team's 2-1 away defeat against Port Talbot Town. "It was the nature of the loss which hurt," he said, "as my team once again pressed the self destruct button."

Aizlewood said after the match away to Port Talbot, "I feel for the players at a time like this" he added. "For the majority of the ninety minutes they are performing competently, but at the moment we have a habit of making things very difficult for ourselves. We do this by creating our own problems with individual errors and lack of personal discipline."

"Overall, we did not look like a side able to pierce the opposing defence, which is a general situation we are endeavouring to resolve. However, as a team we did give a very good defensive performance and justifiably took the lead after seventy minutes."

"I believe that we would not have lost the game if Steven Cann had not been sent off in the eightieth minute for violent conduct. This is a matter which has been dealt with internally and will remain that way. Steve knows that, as an experienced player, he let himself, the club and his teammates down on the night."

Aizlewood continued: "I have looked at our performances in depth and can pinpoint individual errors which have cost us six points to date. This is why I feel sorry for the majority of the players, who are unable to do anything about these mistakes made by their teammates."

However, the fact remains that Carmarthen Town, under Aizlewood's stewardship, has taken one point from a possible eighteen and he is acutely aware that this is not good enough. "I knew that things would not be easy this season after signing a virtually new squad. I was at pains to point out to anybody who would listen that this process was going to take time. This is proving to be the case."

"On a more positive note, we are now considerably better off in terms of points than at the same stage last season. In every league across Europe any team which finished second from bottom one season finds it difficult, if not impossible, to have a complete turnaround the next. This is what I was pointing out to people even before a ball was kicked."

Aizlewood went on to say that the return to being a successful side is a slow, sometimes inconsistent and painful process for players, supporters and management alike. "Neil Smothers and I remain convinced that the way we are running the club and the standards we are setting will ensure eventual improvement. Once the consistency in performance is achieved, and allied to better self discipline from the players, then success, when it comes, can be properly sustained."

The New Saints attend ECA Youth Academy Workshop

The New Saints Head of Youth Scott Ruscoe, together with Scholarship Coach Matty Williams and Chief Operating Officer Ian Williams joined Europe's elite at the ECA (European Club Association) Youth Academies Workshop at Arsenal's Emirates Stadium on Thursday.

A series of presentations were given by leading clubs in Europe including Arsenal, Inter Milan, Ajax and Dinamo Zagreb as part of the ECA's study into Youth Academy Football throughout Europe.

'It was an extremely beneficial day' commented Scott Ruscoe, 'The information shared with over 80 clubs present proved to be very valuable and showed that as a club we are working in the same way as our European counterparts to benefit the players at our club.' he concluded.

Sutton gets semi-pro call-up

An International call-up late on Saturday evening has capped a fine weekend for Newtown's Shane Sutton.



The Hereford-born defender starred at the back for the Robins as his side kept a clean sheet against League Champions TNS in a fine 1-0 win on Saturday afternoon. Then, whilst out enjoying the victory, he was called by his father to say that the FAW had contacted the club asking him to join up with the squad.

"I got a call from my dad who said that the FAW had contacted Newtown secretary Owen Durbridge to see if I could travel to Swansea for the Wales Semi-Pro squad.

"I was celebrating our excellent win over TNS at the time, but as soon as I got the call, my attention turned straight to linking up with the team and the match against Turkey on Tuesday in Port Talbot. I'm absolutely delighted to be with the squad now."

Sutton arrived at the team base in the Towers Hotel on Sunday morning to meet with sixteen of the squad members, which includes four from the TNS side that were beaten by Sutton's Newtown yesterday. Port Talbot's David Brooks is the final player to arrive after his League match in Bala on Sunday.

Capped previously by Wales at Under 17 level, Sutton who is 23, replaces Bangor City's Ryan Edwards in the squad who aggravated a groin in the Citizens 2-1 defeat to Llanelli on Saturday afternoon.

The only other change to the squad sees the uncapped Newport County midfielder Ben Swallow replace Barrow's James Owen, who has withdrawn through illness.
