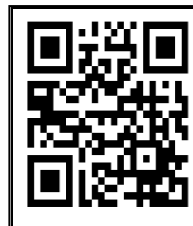


Tomi takes his place in WPL Hall of Fame



Tomi Morgan, one of the Welsh Premier League's characters is the latest to be inducted into the Hall of fame.

Tomi has been involved in the league since its inaugural season when he was a prolific striker with Aberystwyth Town before moving to Llansantffraid where he was part of the Welsh Cup winning side of 1996.

He scored 72 goals in 135 matches but after hanging up his scoring boots Tomi started on a managerial career which would take him on a pilgrimage around Wales.

Carmarthen Town, Rhaeadr Town, Welshpool Town and CPD Porthmadog have all had the privilege of Tomi's team talks but the urge to play was too much and when managing at Y Traeth he came to the field as a 53 year old substitute making him the league's oldest player!

After leaving Porthmadog he returned to Richmond Park before his Welsh Premier League career came full circle in March 2012 as he returned to Park Avenue and Aberystwyth Town.

Stu hopes fun day inspires a new generation of Black & Greens

Aberystwyth Town's high-profile summer signing Stuart Jones is best known for his exploits on the field as a Welsh Cup and Welsh Premier League winning captain. However, in the past few weeks he has been just as busy in his other role as the Club's Development Officer, promoting Saturday's Family Fun Day to local primary schools.

Last week alone Stuart visited Ysgol Gymraeg, Plascrug, Llwyn yr Eos, Rhydypennau and St Padarn's Primary Schools to ensure that local children are aware of Saturday's free event and to encourage the students to take part in the club's T Shirt competition.

Stuart explains: "The Schools have been brilliant, and the kids have really got involved. We're looking forward to having loads of entries to the competition - the kids can design any T shirt they want, and the winning design will be printed and worn by the First Team for their warm up on the Live TV game on Saturday. There has been a lot of interest and we even

have S4C coming along on Monday to help me - and our mascot Sami the Seagull - collect the designs!" The Club has received an astonishing 400 entries to the competition, and the winner will be announced live on S4C on Saturday.

The Family Fun Day on Saturday at Park Avenue will precede S4C's live Welsh Premier League game against Gap Connah's Quay, and runs from 11.30am. Entrance to the event is free, and it will include penalty shoot outs, a bouncy castle, face painting, opportunities to meet the players, coaching sessions and much more.

"We're hoping for a great turn out on Saturday. Through this event the club hopes to show that it really values the local community", said Stuart. "We are trying to inspire a new generation of Black and Green supporters".

Jeffrey looks to the future as Reds begin a new era

Bob Jeffrey, Llanelli AFC Academy Director took over the reigns as first team Manager last week, following the resignation of Andy Legg, with his first game the visit of The New Saints to Stebonheath Park on Saturday.

Looking back to Saturday Bob said:

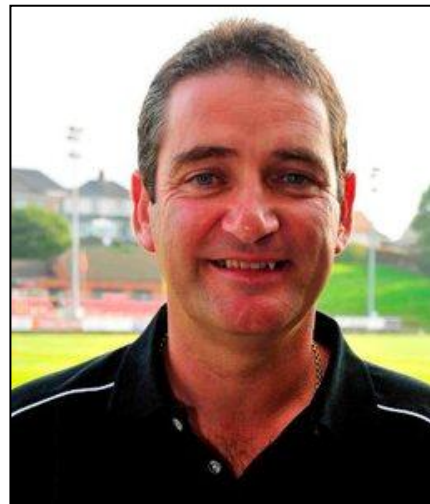
"The first game was bedlam I did not have chance to meet the players until 1 hour before kickoff and it was basically a team talk to introduce myself and Gary (Lloyd) and get on with the game. The good thing was we played the league champions so it was a game that no one expected us to get a result anyway given our recent circumstances."

It had been a week of ups and downs, starting with the sad departure of manager Andy Legg and assistant manager Stephen Jenkins. However following the clubs chairman Nitin Parekh positively appointing academy director Bob Jeffrey as first team manager and Gary Lloyd as his assistant, the club finally received some good news with several of the clubs debts paid off, including the HRMC, former players and the council receiving payment on rent.

Looking to the future Bob has short term and longer term plans, saying: "I have been around the Welsh Premier League for the last 10 years so I know most of the players and opposition. I know all of the opposition management teams and what we need to do to turn the club around. My short term plans are to stabilise the club, to try and get the people currently at the club to try and pull in the same direction. Then we wouldn't have to rely on the chairman (Nitin Parekh) all the time. Longer term I would like to have a five year plan to make the club a community club and to get more local players playing for their town team. One of my first appointments will be a 'Football in the Community Officer' who can link between the community, schools and the academy and this will be done imminently."

Bob's Assistant Manager is Gary Lloyd, who was a coach under the previous management team of Andy Legg and Stephen Jenkins. Bob said: "Gary has been brilliant, he has a wealth of experience of this league both as a player and a coach and his love for the club is second to none. He has great rapport with the current players and they all look up to him. I am looking forward immensely to working with him."

Bob was born in Glasgow, but has lived in Llanelli for over 20 years. Bob said: "believe it or not I only came to Llanelli for a holiday and I have been here ever since. I was born in Glasgow and was raised in a suburb called Gallowgate. When I was 8 years old my family moved to Burnley. I left school with 6 O Levels, my favourite subject was Geography. I played football for the school team, Barden High School in Burnley and played in a Lancashire Schools Cup Final.



Most of my football was played in the North West Counties League, where I played for Keighly Green and Burnley United. When I came to Llanelli I played for Pembrey United and Llanelli A & B teams, where I became friendly with Neil O'Brien. We met up again at Carmarthen Town when he was playing and I was reserve team player/coach. Neil was offered the managers' job at Llanelli the following year and he offered me the chance to become his coach which I accepted. I then worked as Swansea City Goalkeeping coach and assisted with the youth team. This involved a lot of work and travelling but it was a great experience and very good for my coach education. I applied for the job as Llanelli academy director in August 2006 and was fortunate to be offered the post and started work that September."

Bob will be continuing with his role as academy director for the time being. He said: "Llanelli Academy is going really well. We have just had two players who signed scholarships at football league clubs, Connor Evans at Bristol City and Callum Silcox at Barnet. We have teams at Under 12, Under 14 and Under 16 level which compete against other South Wales Academies. It is essential that we not only produce quality players but we also produce quality coaches and it is my responsibility to get all our coaches through their coaching badges and a coach education programme, so we can produce better players. If Holland can do it then why not Wales."

Bob is looking to the town to come together and help support the club starting with the next home game against Aberystwyth Town at Stebonheath Park, a week on Friday (30th November, kick off 7.30pm). He said: "The club is here for the foreseeable future. So get behind the club and come and support the boys. The problem is you do not know what you have until it is gone. I have sorted the training facilities, we have a link with the local college and part of the deal is we have access to their facilities. So we will be training there from now on. The supporters have been brilliant and they are the heart and soul of the club. We need to keep them involved in the future and hopefully we can attract some more to the games."

For Gary Lloyd, Reds new assistant manager it has been a difficult few weeks at the club. He said: "I have been very close times on leaving the club, it's been hard, especially with Andy and Steve leaving making things even harder. We will be aiming to get the moral going with the boys as it is rock bottom at moment. And suspensions and injuries aren't helping, but with a full side I still think we can beat any side in the league. I would ask the supporters to be patient as the players are rock bottom at moment and need lifting. I just urge them to get behind us and stick with us through this difficult time."

Liza Lloyd, manageress of the Reds Social Club is looking forward to the future. She said: "The club is now open every evening from 6pm apart from Wednesdays. We can take booking for any private functions, including weddings, funerals, wakes, children's parties and even 18th birthday parties. The club has always been dear to me as it is where myself and my brother Gary were brought up and we have a special affiliation with the people there. My father kept it for years and it's my aim to make a success of the club. We have always seen it as our club and the plan is to take the club upwards and onwards and get more people coming there and involved. I just hope the people of the town now get behind us and support us as we are a massive part of the history of Llanelli. We have a massive home game coming up on Friday 30th November against Aberystwyth Town and need the towns backing more than ever. It's the start of a new era."
